You are required to utilise basic HTML and CSS to write a small webpage containing your answer to the following questions.

You must make sufficient effort to ensure the submitted webpage is properly formatted. Failure to comply will result in a ZERO grade. Your submission must be a zip file with **exactly** following file structure:

The usage of incorrect filenames will result in a grade of 0.

Lab 3

Base your lab 3 on your existing submission from lab 2, continue to add features and make improvements.

1. Previously, all the answers to the 2 questions are in the same HTML file. In Lab 3, you are to separate them. Put the 4 layers of computer networks in `q1.html`, put the WWW portion in `q2.html`. Your `index.html` should now be a homepage or welcome page. Write a few nice words to welcome the visitors of your webpage.
2. Create a menu section, similar to the one found on jetic.org. The menu bar will:
 1. Contain hyperlinks to `index.html`, `q1.html`, and `q2.html` with appropriate titles;
 2. Be found on `index.html`, `q1.html`, and `q2.html` with identical locations and styles;
 3. Take up exactly 30% of the webpage space to the left;
 4. Be fixed, doesn't move as I scroll through the rest of the page;
 5. Not block any content displayed on the rest of the page;
 6. Have a light grey background colour.
3. Use `style.css` to:
 1. Centre the welcome message on your `index.html` to the centre of the main area (70% of the screen on the right, the left is the menu), both horizontally and vertically;
 2. Make sure you position the headings in `q1.html` and `q2.html` are aligned to the centre;
 3. Make sure all of the content in your main area has paddings of exactly 10px on all 4 directions.

4. Make any other stylistic choices as you please.
